

**April Field Trip- Tudor Place  
Washington, DC  
April 18, 2009

Tudor Place was built by Martha Washington's granddaughter, Martha Custis Peter, and her husband, Thomas Peter. William Thornton, architect of the U.S. Capitol, who designed the house in the neoclassical style with a circular domed portico and expansive gardens. Completed in 1816, Tudor Place remained under the ownership of six succeeding generations of the Peter family until 1983.

Today the 5 ½ acre garden maintains much of the original Federal period design. It is comprised of a Bowling Green, Tennis lawn, Flower Knot, Boxwood Ellipse and Japanese Tea House.

The garden is open from 10-4 pm and there are house tours on the hour from 10 until 3 pm. Admission is \$3 for the gardens and \$8 for a house tour.
